

Memorandum of Understanding Between:

Ngati Koata and;

Mana Cruising Club, Waikawa Boating Club and Pelorus Boating Club (the Clubs).

The purpose of this memorandum includes:

1. Respecting relationships between Ngati Koata as Tangatawhenua (including adjacent landowners) and the Clubs' members.
2. Protecting and respecting the environment.
3. Ngati Koata tikanga includes but is not limited to the principle that the environment and the people are connected and provide for each other.
4. Respecting the rights to peaceful enjoyment of both parties.

The area of this understanding:


is a line from Harding Point, including Kurupongi (Trio Islands), Nga Kiore, (Jag rocks) Takapourewa, (Stephens Island) Nga Tamahine a Pani, (The Sisters), extending as necessary around Nile Head and the western side of Rangitoto ki te Taonga (D'urville Island), and then to Horl Bay.

Tikanga:

All vessels will abide by Ngati Koata tikanga, which includes but is not limited to: respecting environmental values, including aquatic life; being good neighbours and the like.


1. All vessels must have operating holding tanks or treatment systems with evidence to be provided to adjacent landowner, or their representative, upon request.
2. Respect riparian ownership, in the case of Maori land this may extend to the low water mark.
3. Where moorings are adjacent to privately owned property, the owner's rights to peace and enjoyment will be respected. In the case of unacceptable behaviour, the name of the boat, the date and time of the incident can be reported to the manager of any of the three boating Clubs for action to be taken. That action is to be reported back to the complainant.
4. Ngati Koata and the clubs, within one month of receipt of written notice of complaint, will jointly carry out an investigation to resolve matters in a respectful manner.
5. Having two club moorings in a restricted flushing area such as Mill Arm, is an environmental and tikanga risk. Ngati Koata and the clubs will work together to resolve this concern.
6. In the case where dwellings are in a bay where moorings are located, discharging offal, including fish, shellfish, and the like, within the bay is prohibited.


